Age 45, of Gardner, IL passed away unexpectedly on Tuesday, March 18, 2025, at his home.

He was enthusiastic about mentoring youth hunters and introduced scores of young men and women to the sport. He loved fishing with friends, and he especially loved waterfowl and predator hunting. Jason was employed by Dibble Trucking in Gardner and was a parts Manager and data processor.

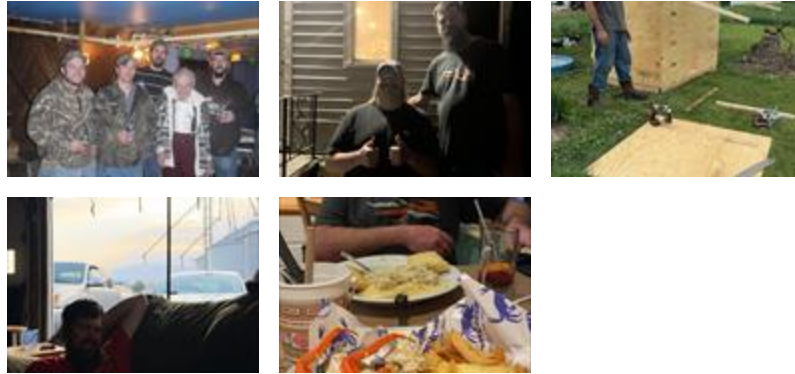

Nate, Ben and I had somewhat recently gotten Nintendo, and Jason was upstairs helming the controllers. The call came from downstairs that it was time to saddle up and head to the beach. Food, lawn chairs, and towels were fussed into the back of cars and minivans, and off we went. As we unloaded and began the day-long, sun-drenched affair, someone (my memory doesn't recall who) queried, "Where's Gus?" A quick head count revealed our party was one short of capacity. A rescue team (of whom memory again fails) was promptly dispatched back down Whitetie Rd, where, as lore has it, Jason was found upstairs, dutifully smooshing mushrooms and squashing turtles. So engaged in Super Mario's exploits, he was unaware of the convoy--assembled in his honor--having departed.
