Age 62, of Braidwood, Illinois, passed away peacefully on May 18, 2026 surrounded by his loved ones after a long battle with cancer. Born in Joliet, Illinois on November 3, 1963, Nick was the son of Harry “Budd” and Phyllis Ann (Lewis) Adams. He grew up with a strong sense of loyalty, grit, and service—qualities that would define his entire life.

After graduating high school, Nick went on to play football for the Tennessee Volunteers as a kicker. A foot injury ended his time on the field, but it opened the door to the path he was truly meant for. He enlisted in the United States Marine Corps, serving from 1985 to 1991 with the 1st Battalion, 1st Marine Regiment (1/1), 1st Marine Regiment. A Reconnaissance Man and Marine Raider, Nick was highly trained, disciplined, and deeply committed to his brothers in arms. He spoke both Somali and Swahili and was honorably discharged at the rank of Corporal. Though he was immensely proud of his service, he rarely spoke of it—his humility as steady as his courage.

Following his military career, Nick continued serving his country through work with the Department of Defense and the CIA. Before beginning his long career in law enforcement, he held a variety of roles including coaching football at Joliet Junior College, graduating mortuary school, and serving as a police officer in both Harvey and Rockdale.

Nick ultimately found his professional home with the Village of Elwood Police Department. As Elwood's first full time police officer, he dedicated 25 years to the community with integrity, steadiness, and a quiet sense of duty. During his time at Elwood he served not only as a patrol officer, but also in the evidence section and overweight truck enforcement.

On May 17, 2003, Nick married Cynthia "Cindy" (Hayes), the love of his life. Together, they shared a deep bond built on devotion, humor, and adventure. Nick and Cindy loved traveling to Cedar Point and Dollywood, always chasing the next thrill. Nick's adventurous, adrenaline seeking spirit led them to skydive, bungee jump, and zipline. And in true Nick fashion, he even jumped off the top of the Stratosphere in Las Vegas—with Cindy and Karen by his side.

Nick is survived by his wife Cindy; his faithful canine companion, Smokey; and his special friend, Karen Smietanski; his daughter, Vittoria Wurl and granddaughter, Phiona; his brother, Harry "Jim" Adams; mother-in-law, Shirley; sister-in-law Dana (Jeff) Blatti; and one niece and three nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, Budd and Phyllis, his sister, Crystal; father-in-law Bob "the barber" Hayes.

Services will be held at R.W. Patterson Funeral Home & Crematory in Braidwood, Wednesday, May 27, 2026. Visitation will be from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Services at 11:00 a.m. followed by inurnment at Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery at 1:00 p.m.

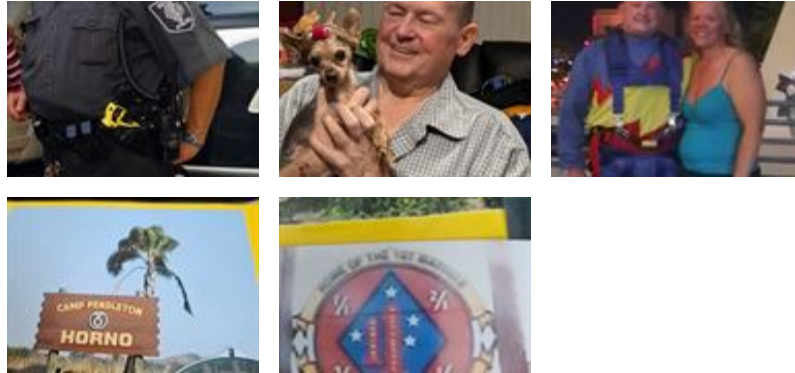
