Ronald E. "Ronnie" Mohalick, 73, passed away late in the morning on Sunday, February 7, 2021 after battling the lasting effects of Covid-19 and prior conditions. Ron, of Bourbonnais, IL and formerly Wilmington, IL, was born on April 22, 1947 in Lockport, IL to parents Raymond and Mildred L. (Wilson) Mohalick. After serving in the United States Army as a helicopter mechanic in Korea he began a long career of factory work, and eventually joined Local 9 of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers.
